Minutes of the Daviess County Commission May 14, 2025

The Honorable Daviess County Commission met on Wednesday, May 14, 2025, at 8:00 a.m. Jim Ruse, Presiding Commissioner, called the meeting to order. David Cox, 1st District, and Wayne Uthe, 2nd District, are present.

The Commission approved last week's minutes and invoices.

James Lewis, Road and Bridge Supervisor, updated the Commission on the projects they have been working on since last Wednesday. The crew is still spraying brush around the county. They cleaned out a low-water crossing in Grand River Township.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Mini-split expansion project is still in the planning phase; no update at this time.

The Commission met with Lacey Corwin, Collector, Aaron Piburn, Assessor, and Rachel Taylor, County Clerk, to discuss the results of the Senior Tax Credit. The application process has continued to be smooth.

Both the financial audit and the Missouri State procedural audit are progressing as expected.

The Commission discussed the Daviess County Nursing and Rehab projects and approved paying for the sidewalk repairs from the Care Center fund. The other projects that were presented will need to be paid for out of the Nursing Home's budget, according to the contract with the Nursing Home.

The Commission discussed hiring a handyman to do odd jobs around the Courthouse and other County buildings.
